

When we witness something unimaginable, we face a fundamental question. Do we accept it, changing our minds to accommodate it, or do we refuse, denying what we have just witnessed? The Pharisees in today's Gospel choose the latter. They refuse to change their attitudes about keeping the Sabbath or the sinfulness of the one born blind. The man's parents choose the latter as well, though likely out of fear. They choose to deny what they saw rather than risk being expelled from the synagogue. But not the blind man himself: He accepts this miracle worker as the Son of Man. It wasn't only his literal vision that was changed.

What keeps us from seeing the truth? What keeps me from acknowledging what we see?



FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a

In seeking a King for the Israelites, Samuel traveled to Jesse of Bethlehem, who had seven sons. Commanded by God to ignore the elder sons, Samuel anointed the youngest, David.

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:8-14

Paul exhorts the Ephesians to live as "children of light" in goodness and truth and to avoid evil deeds "done in darkness."

Gospel: John 9:1-41

Jesus performs the miracle of giving sight to the man born blind. Because Jesus performed this miracle on the Sabbath, the Pharisees called him a "sinner," but the blind man said, "He is a prophet." Jesus later reveals to the blind man that He is the Son of Man.

The Tradition of the St. Joseph Table "Tavola di San Giuseppe"



A "table" in honor of St. Joseph, whose Solemnity we celebrate on March 19, is a special tradition that comes to us from Sicily where St. Joseph is regarded as the island's patron saint. A Middle Age legend attributes the end of a devastating drought to a prayer devotion that the people Sicilian made to Joseph. Food crops for both people and livestock were destroyed

because of the drought and the people and animals were starving. The Sicilians begged St. Joseph to intercede for them and, sure enough, rain fell and saved the people from starvation and certain death. After the bountiful harvest, the people of Sicily wanted to express their gratitude. The wealthy families prepared huge buffet tables with special foods to honor St. Joseph and thank him for his intercession. They invited the poor, the homeless and the sick to share at the table. All the remaining food and proceeds were then given to the less fortunate.
