Up until now in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus has been carrying out his mission all over Galilee: curing the sick and driving out demons, teaching crowds and welcoming sinners, proclaiming God's Kingdom. The disciples have watched him do all this. Now he calls upon them to do the same. He knows that he will not be able to do it all by himself forever. He knows that he will have to leave his work in the hands of others, of laborers for the harvest. Two thousand years later, we are his disciples, likewise deputized to tend to those with physical or emotional infirmities, to embrace the lost and troubled, and to give hope to the weary. This is our mission.

How can we be called to be a laborer for the harvest? What concrete thing can we do this week to carry out Jesus' mission?



#### **ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

#### First Reading: Exodus 19:2-6a

God tells Moses that the Israelites will be "dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine." Even though God loves all people, the Israelites would be a special and holy nation if they honored God's covenant.

#### Second Reading: Romans 5:6-11

Paul describes how all sinners have been reconciled to God by Christ's death. Now it is possible for all people to be saved by his life, if we follow the teachings of Jesus.

#### Gospel: Matthew 9:36-10:8

Jesus felt great pity toward the crowd, who lay on the ground exhausted. Jesus knew that many people needed leadership, so he sent his disciples out to teach. He gave the twelve the power to cure disease and expel unclean spirits. Jesus told them, "The gift you have received, give as a gift".

#### CORPUS CHRISTI FOOD COLLECTION



MARIAN PILGRIMAGE TO THE BASILICA



The Paterson Diocese is inviting local Catholics to take part in what promises to be a powerful spiritual experience: a Marian pilgrimage to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. in October. Participants have two options: a one-day pilgrimage on Saturday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, or an overnight, two-day pilgrimage, from Friday, October 13<sup>th</sup> to Saturday, October 14<sup>th</sup>.

All pilgrims will visit the impressive Byzantine and Romanesque basilica. They will attend Mass with Bishop Kevin J. Sweeney on his first diocesan pilgrimage as bishop and have the opportunity for confession in the Crypt Church. Pilgrims also can pray a multilingual rosary and Chaplet of Divine Mercy and enjoy quiet time in personal prayer. The basilica has more than 80 chapels and oratories.

The one-day experience will include bus transportation to Washington, D.C., from various parishes in the Paterson Diocese, leaving between 6 and 6:45 AM depending on the departure point. The cost is \$65 per person, which includes bus transportation, gratuities, and activities at the shrine.
