Jesus uses the vineyard theme to speak of his coming suffering and death. He speaks of how the landowner lent out the vineyard to tenants. They refused to uphold their part of the bargain for when it was time for them to pay their rent, they first abused the servants sent to receive it, and then killed them. When the landowner sent his son to collect the rent, they decided to kill him too.

This story is an obvious parallel to what the Jewish leaders did to Jesus. God had entrusted the Jewish people with the covenant. They had abused and killed the prophets whom God sent. Then, when in the fullness of time God sent his only Son, they killed him. They would be punished for rejecting God's only-begotten Son, and others would be invited to take their place as the chosen people (e.g., the Gentiles).

What one specific thing can we do with our time and talents to produce fruit in the vineyard we call home?



#### TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

This passage about the failure of the Lord's vineyard is a metaphor for the ingratitude of the people of Israel and Judah. In tones of sadness and rebuke, the Lord asks, "What more was there to do for my vineyard?"

#### Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

In a moving appeal to the Philippians, Paul exhorts them to embrace all that is pure, decent, and admirable; then God's peace will be theirs.

#### Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

In another rebuke to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus recounts a parable in which the owner of a vineyard leases his vineyard to tenant farmers. When the owner sends his servants and even his son to claim his rightful share of the crops, the tenants kill all of them. With some bitterness, Jesus warns the chief priests that "the Kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people that will yield a rich harvest.

# TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with Thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus...keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you."

When we receive a greeting card, we often hastily read the message, but respond with silent gratitude for the sender, their thoughtfulness in sharing their message with us. Consider this as you reread the message of St. Paul.

In offering encouragement to the Philippians, he exhorts them in their prayer to include, as all prayer should, both requests, gratitude and need. The fruit of prayer is the peace of God. As he completes this teaching he offers himself as a model as teacher and witness. The church asks us to accept Paul as a pattern and write our own message mirrored in the words he included in his card.
