Due to an early holiday deadline by the publication company, the "Sharing Our Treasure" will be published in the December 4, 2022 bulletin.

Even this year, when Advent begins as early as it possibly can, it still doesn't arrive before the deluge of Christmas music, decorations, and advertisements already inundates us – not to mention the biggest shopping day of the year this past Friday. But today's Gospel provides us with a bracing counterpoint to this premature merriment. There'll be no parties in anticipation of the apocalypse!

Pondering the Second Coming, no matter how unlikely it seems at any given time, serves to focus our minds on what is truly important. What if you knew you had only a year to live? Or a month? Or a day? If Judgment Day was on the horizon, how would you spend what little time you had remaining? It is important to remember that we simply do not know how much time we have. Therefore, we must always be prepared. We must live today as if it were the last day of our lives.



FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

The words of Isaiah urge all people to forsake war and to live in peace forever. The tone reaches a climax in the words, "One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again."

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14

Paul invites us to put away all the things of darkness and sin and to prepare for the coming of Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44

A comparison is made between the destruction caused by the flood in Noah's time and the need to be prepared for the second coming of Christ. "You must be prepared in the same way. The Son of Man is coming at the time you least expect."




