

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6

This reading is a short passage from the second song of the Servant of the Lord. The Lord will show his glory through His servant whose mission is to restore Israel and bring salvation “to the ends of the earth.”

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

Paul sends greetings to the people of Corinth, who have been called to be holy and consecrated in Christ.

Gospel: John 1:29-34

When Jesus visits John, John recognizes Jesus as the “Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.” John further indicates that Jesus is truly the Messiah and “God’s chosen One.”

SHARING OUR TREASURE

Due to vacation, Sharing Our Treasure will be published in the January 22, 2023 bulletin.

John the Baptist identified Jesus as the Lamb of God. The word in Aramaic for “lamb” is almost the same as the word for “servant.” Jesus is both the servant of God foretold by the prophet Isaiah and the lamb whose sacrifice would obtain forgiveness of our sins.

In the Gospel of John, the Spirit descends and remains upon Jesus in the form of a dove. Jesus, throughout his ministry, possesses the anointing of the Spirit of God.

John the Baptist consistently points to Jesus as the Messiah in the Gospel of John. He reminds us that we should not use our faith for our own self-aggrandizement, e.g., seeking to be “important” in parish life, considering ourselves to be better than others, judging them, etc. We always should point to Jesus in what we say and do.





LECTORS FOR MASS



A Lector carries the Book of the Gospels to the altar during the procession at the beginning of the Mass. In addition, the Lector reads the first two scripture readings and the Psalm at Masses with no music cantor during the Liturgy of the Word. The Lector also leads the universal prayer intentions if a deacon is not assisting the priest during the Mass. Lectors proclaim the scriptures at the liturgies, Holy Days, and other special days. All Lectors receive training prior to being scheduled. The time commitment for this ministry is approximately one Mass per month although additional time may be requested to cover Holy Days and special services. We are especially hoping for interest for the 10:00 AM and 12 Noon Masses but anyone interested is welcome. Every effort is made to schedule you for your preferred Mass.
