In today's Gospel Jesus calls us to a "higher" love. He urges us to avoid practicing spiritual minimalism, looking to do only the bare minimum of what is required or "good enough" method. Jesus clearly raises the bar when he tells his listeners that it isn't enough to avoid killing your neighbor; you must avoid growing angry with or holding a grudge against your neighbor. You must be reconciled with your neighbor. It isn't enough to avoid committing adultery; we must also avoid looking at others in ways that objectify them for our own gratification. Rather than waste your time by looking at others, your time would be better spent by examining yourself. It isn't enough to avoid making a false oath; you should avoid putting yourself in any situation in which you would feel obliged to swear to anything. Simply say what you mean and mean what you say.

God, help us to live this higher love. Help us to avoid trying to simply "get by" in life; help us to understand what it means to truly live...by fully loving.



SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20

This passage from Sirach gives strong, unequivocal emphasis to free will in every person. Before each of us is set, sin or virtue, life or death, and each of us are free to choose one or the other.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Paul explains to the Corinthians that there are two different kinds of wisdom — the wisdom of God and the wisdom of the world. The wisdom of God is mysterious, but this wisdom has been revealed "to those who love him" through the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people he has come to fulfill the law. He speaks strongly against murder and anger, against adultery and lust, and against false oaths and lies. He warns the people that unless their virtue exceeds that of the Pharisees, they "will not enter the kingdom of God."



B - 1:30 PM to 3:00 PM




