Jesus tells us that when we choose him, we are like an Amish farmer in Lancaster County - who sets his hand to his plow and does not look back. No one plows a straight furrow while looking back over his shoulder. No one can be a disciple of Jesus while looking back at what is behind him and still move forward undistracted.

The temptation to use violence motivated by religion was present even within the small circle of the apostles. Jesus rebukes them and insists that the struggle must take place within our hearts. Am I really ready to follow him whatever the cost? The enthusiasm of the convert is not enough, for the stakes are high, and I really need to deny myself, and carry my cross every day. It is only by looking at my deeds that I discover how near or far I am from being Jesus' disciple.

I look at the quality of my commitments and ask for the grace not to look back as I place my hand on the plow.





THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21

Elijah the prophet followed God's instruction to appoint a man named Elisha as his successor. Elijah threw his cloak over Elisha, who went and said good-bye to his family, then followed Elijah without question.

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Paul reminds us that people were freed from the old law through Christ. But he makes it clear that this freedom does not mean giving in to evil desires. Instead, we must be guided by the Spirit and most importantly love our neighbor as ourselves.

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

Jesus set out for Jerusalem, and passed through a town where he was not welcomed. He reprimanded his disciples for desiring vengeance against the town. One man wanted to follow Jesus when he had finished his duties at home. Jesus expressed that a man who begins a task, but constantly looks back is unfit for the reign of God.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

GRADES K-6

Registration forms for the 2022-2023 CCD school year were sent out via email last week. If you do not receive it or if your email address has changed since last year's registration (which would have been last summer), please be sure to email us at stjoelp@optonline.net with your new email address. Registration forms will be available on the back tables in church and in our Parish Center.

First Holy Communion – Children are required to complete 1st grade of Religious Education before they can enter into the 2nd grade of our program for First Holy Communion.

Registration for **new** students will also be taking place. Our program begins with Kindergarten and continues through Grade 6. If you have a child in **Kindergarten only**, the registration fee is \$30. A copy of their baptismal certificate is required for each new child registered. Families must be registered members of the parish when registering for the program.

GROW IN FAITH

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS



The Knights of Columbus use recycled aluminum cans as a source of revenue to "Help Us Help Others". We have a pickup at St. Joseph's Church every Saturday morning between 9 AM and 11 AM. We take as many

cans (aluminum only) as you can drop off: soda cans, beer cans, etc. Please help the Knights help those of us in need.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

If you are planning to have your child baptized, you should be aware of the following regulations:

Unless you receive prior permission, the child is to be baptized in your parish, which is the parish in which you are registered or where you live. All Catholics in the United States belong to a full territorial parish by virtue of their address.

You have to make a pledge to raise the child in the faith. If there is sufficient doubt in the priest's mind that the parents will not raise the child in the faith, he can refuse to do the baptism.

According to the new Code of Canon Law, the sponsors for the child (godparents) must both be baptized and one must be a practicing Roman Catholic. The new Code of Canon Law also insists that the Roman Catholic sponsor must have received both the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

Requests for a baptismal date should be made two months in advance. Parents having their first child baptized must participate in a preparation program.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are planning to be married, you should be aware of the following regulations:

The diocese requires one year's notification to the parish before your marriage. If two Catholics are getting married, the marriage may take place in the parish of the bride or the groom. If they are getting married in another parish, they need a letter of permission from their own parish.

If a Catholic marries a non-Catholic and they wish to marry in a ceremony other than that of the Roman Catholic Church, this is possible but requires permission of the Church. All other regulations must be met. A non-Catholic minister can be part of a Catholic ceremony.

Pre-Cana is required before marriage. If either party has been married before, whether Catholic or not, an impediment exists which must be removed by the Church's Tribunal before they can remarry.

"But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, rather, serve one another through love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself... I say this then, live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh."

St. Paul spoke to the Galatians, and his message demands that we listen today. Surrounded by so much that draws us away from Christ, we need the Spirit to have self-esteem and respect, love for others, so that we can express our love of God. Maybe we should take them in the same order. Use the word 'I' and 'Mine' less frequently. Avoid the terrible allure of the internet and porn. Discover the richness of our faith in prayer, learning and good works.

Believe in the following steps. I am loved immensely by God. I do not earn it, He showers His love, life and forgiveness on me, at this very moment. Convinced of this reality, I live my care and concern for others, as they too are loved by God and made in His image and likeness. I am then truly free to love my God.
