SHARING OUR TREASURE

Any form of ministry can easily degenerate into an attempt to complete a series of tasks rather than be of service to the people whom we are supposedly serving. We can be more concerned with the number of meals we serve at the soup kitchen than with treating each individual with dignity. We can be more concerned with the number of people in our religious education classes or in our RCIA program than with the fact that we should listen to where they are in their faith journey and what they need to learn. Jesus always took time for the individual and treated each person with sacred respect.



SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham, who saw three men standing near his tent. Sensing they were messengers, he hurriedly brought them food and water to refresh themselves. Upon leaving, the men told him that they would visit in a year, at which time his childless wife Sarah would have a son.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28

Paul discusses the suffering Christ endured for his Church. He describes his willingness to also endure suffering in Jesus' name. Paul hopes that through his sacrifices, many people will become complete in Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 10:38-42

Jesus was welcomed into the home of a woman named Martha. She complained to Jesus that her sister Mary sat listening to him instead of helping with the tasks of entertaining. Jesus told Martha that her sister had chosen the more important task, and should be allowed to listen.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION GRADES K-6

Registration forms for the 2022-2023 are due back August 1st. A \$20 late fee for registrations received after August 1st will be charged.

Registration forms will be available on the back tables in church and in our Parish Center.

First Holy Communion – Children are required to complete 1st grade of Religious Education before they can enter into the 2nd grade of our program for First Holy Communion.

Registration for **new** students will also be taking place. Our program begins with Kindergarten and continues through Grade 6. If you have a child in **Kindergarten only**, the registration fee is \$30. A copy of their baptismal certificate is required for each new child registered. Families must be registered members of the parish when registering for the program.

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church, of which I am a minister, in accordance with God's stewardship given to me to bring to completion for you the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages and from generations past."
