THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

Isaiah tells of the Lord's servant, who will be inconspicuous, but will not rest until justice is established. The Lord then tells his servant that he was formed to be "a light for the nations."

Second Reading: Acts 10:34-38

Peter speaks to a group of pagans for the first time. He explains to them that any person who follows God's will is acceptable to God, regardless of nationality.

Gospel: Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

John the Baptist had claimed one would come far more powerful than himself, one who would baptize with the Holy Spirit rather than water. When Jesus came to John and was baptized, the Spirit descended on him and a voice said, "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests."

It may not be immediately apparent, but Luke's account of Jesus' baptism reveals that Jesus engaged in dialogue with his Father. Luke says that upon being baptized, Jesus prayed to his Father. As he prayed, God spoke to him from the heavens, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased". Though heaven could not be seen opening on the occasion of our own baptism, we are indeed God's beloved sons and daughters.

As we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of Jesus, we are invited to reflect upon the significance of our own Baptisms. Do I really believe that I have died to one form of life so that I might live in Christ? What does it mean for me to be a child of God? Do I renew my Baptismal promises every time I sign myself with the Sign of the Cross with holy water whenever I enter or leave church?

Let us pray to God as Jesus did, as Jesus taught us, and realize how pleased God is in us.

Stewardship is a Way of Life

The Stewardship Way of Life is the grateful, unselfish response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God's gifts and shares these gifts in the love of God and their neighbor. It is a spiritual way of life marked by faith filled prayer, compassionate service to others and a generous sharing of time, talent and treasure. The more we give back to God, the richer our spiritual lives become. Jesus not only calls people to Him, but also forms them and sends them out in His service. Becoming a follower of Christ leads naturally to the practice of Stewardship, the living out a commitment to be Christ-centered rather than self-centered. Joining a Ministry is a way of thanking God for all the blessings He has granted to you and your family and helps to make our parish stronger and the world a better place for all. SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

If you are planning to have your child baptized, you should be aware of the following regulations:

Unless you receive prior permission, the child is to be baptized in your parish, which is the parish in which you are registered or where you live. All Catholics in the United States belong to a full territorial parish by virtue of their address.

You have to make a pledge to raise the child in the faith. If there is sufficient doubt in the priest's mind that the parents will not raise the child in the faith, he can refuse to do the baptism.

According to the new Code of Canon Law, the sponsors for the child (godparents) must both be baptized and one must be a practicing Roman Catholic. The new Code of Canon Law also insists that the Roman Catholic sponsor must have received both the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

Requests for a baptismal date should be made two months in advance. Parents having their first child baptized must participate in a preparation program.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are planning to be married, you should be aware of the following regulations:

The diocese requires one year notification to the parish before your marriage. If two Catholics are getting married, the marriage may take place in the parish of the bride or the groom. If they are getting married in another parish, they need a letter of permission from their own parish.

If a Catholic marries a non-Catholic and they wish to marry in a ceremony other than that of the Roman Catholic Church, this is possible but requires permission of the Church. All other regulations must be met. A non-Catholic minister can be part of a Catholic ceremony.

Pre-Cana is required before marriage. If either party has been married before, whether Catholic or not, an impediment exists which must be removed by the Church's Tribunal before they can remarry.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

Only a living person can receive one of the seven sacraments. Families should not wait until someone is on the verge of death to contact a priest. Anyone who is seriously ill, has a chronic illness, or is going to have major surgery should be anointed. It is a beautiful and comforting sacrament. THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

"The people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their heart whether John might be the Christ... After all the people were and Jesus had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased.'"

The scene is familiar, the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus, and the affirming voice of the Father. John hesitated, but Jesus insisted, showing His total identity with the people He came to save. Our baptism initiated our Christian journey, as we accepted our mission sharing with Jesus as priest, prophet, and king. As we live our baptismal commission, can we hear the same affirming voice of the Father approving our lives and witness to Jesus Christ? Yes, we are beloved, is He pleased, or can we do more?

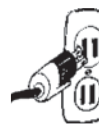

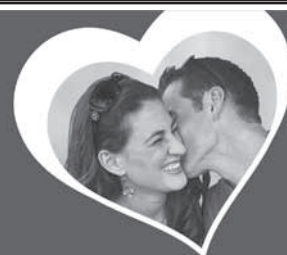

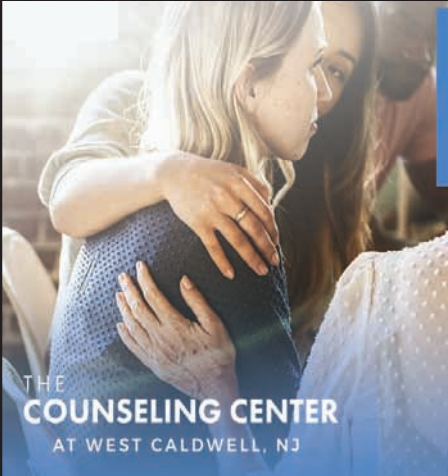
