Jesus was very clear when he taught his disciples to pray. This is what he said: "Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come!" It is on this foundation that you ask for a new start in your life and for everything you need for that life. You also have to ask God to forgive you for all you did wrong in the past, and don't hesitate to remind God that you are doing the same, that you are forgiving anyone who might have harmed you.

And ask not to be misled, but to be guided in the correct way. Jesus does not tell *what* we should pray, but *how*.

No nonsense, no long prayers... just straightforwardly tell what you expect from the one who put you in this life, and whom you trust in everything.

Jesus ends with a story about a neighbor who gets loaves of bread because of his persistence. Obviously, Jesus is telling us that to be timid in praying to God is no sign of confidence in the Father.



#### SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32

Abraham pleads with the Lord, who planned to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah because of the evil and sin in those cities. Abraham asks him if he would spare the city if fifty, forty, thirty, twenty or even only ten innocent people were found there. God says that he would spare the cities even for the sake of only ten.

#### Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14

Paul explains to the Colossians that through baptism, they are raised to life with Christ because they believed in the power of the God who raised him from the dead. Even though they once lived in sin, their sins have been pardoned through Jesus.

#### Gospel: Luke 11:1-13

Jesus' disciples asked him how they should pray. He gave them some phrases similar to those now used in the Lord's prayer. Jesus also reminds the disciples how even men with sins are able to give good things to their children, and explains how much more the heavenly Father wants to give to us.

#### **GRADES K-6**

Registration forms for the 2022-2023 are due back August 1<sup>st</sup>. A \$20 late fee for registrations received after August 1<sup>st</sup> will be charged.

Registration forms will be available on the back tables in church and in our Parish Center.

**First Holy Communion** – Children are required to complete 1<sup>st</sup> grade of Religious Education before they can enter into the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade of our program for First Holy Communion.

Registration for **new** students will also be taking place. Our program begins with Kindergarten and continues through Grade 6. If you have a child in **Kindergarten only**, the registration fee is \$30. A **copy** of their baptismal certificate is required for each new child registered. Families must be registered members of the parish when registering for the program.

#### **CONFIRMATION PROGRAM GRADES 7-8**

Confirmation Registration Forms will be sent out via email in August.

#### **CONFIRMATION INFORMATION**

On Saturday, October 8, 2022, the present Confirmation Class, ('21-'22) will be confirmed by Bishop Serratelli at 11 AM here at St. Joseph's Church.

The final requirements for their Confirmation are:

- attendance at Mass
- selection of a Confirmation name (must be a saints' name)
- selecting a Sponsor
- attendance at the Retreat that is scheduled for September 17th at 9AM
- Confession before making Confirmation

Those who choose to be confirmed are, in a sense, claiming their choice for their faith and are affirming their desire to be a member of the Roman Catholic Church and a true disciple of Jesus. After receiving the gifts of the Holy Spirit there should be a willingness to be and do for others, as well as sharing their God-given gifts with those in need. They are to give witness to God in their lives.

Additionally, once someone receives the sacrament of Confirmation they are eligible to be a Lector at Mass, a sponsor for a candidate in Confirmation and a Godparent at a Baptism.

#### SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him: 'Lord teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples.' He said, 'when you pray, say....And I tell you, ask and you shall receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened to you."

How familiar! Can I picture Jesus at prayer, as when He was in the garden of Gethsemane, asking His Father to take the cup 'but not my will, but yours be done?' Can I picture Him praying as He blessed the loaves and fishes? Can I see Him at prayer as He prepared the breakfast for the apostles at the seashore? Can I hear His prayer as He said 'little girl get up?' Jesus at prayer.

He not only provided us with the words we recite so frequently, but we also hear Him tell us — right now - ask, seek, knock. Do I accept His teaching, as He taught the disciple who asked?
