January is not a common month for weddings in this country. Nevertheless, a wedding is at the center of today's Gospel. It is at this wedding feast that Jesus performs his first miracle, changing water into wine. Though we are not here today to celebrate a wedding, today's celebration includes both feast and miracle, ones we often take for granted. Let us consider the miracle that takes place in our presence today – the bread and wine becoming Christ's Body and Blood – and give thanks for the invitation we have been given to this Eucharistic feast.

In partaking in the Eucharist, we are transformed by Christ's Body and Blood. No matter how we feel about ourselves, we are not forsaken or desolate. We are God's children, each a cause for God's rejoicing, continually transformed and renewed in holiness as Christians.

#### **SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

#### First Reading: Isaiah 62:1-5

Isaiah prophesizes that Jerusalem will again be held in high esteem by God. He states that all nations will witness its glory. He compares a groom's joy toward his bride to the joy that God will feel toward Jerusalem.

#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

Paul discusses the different gifts and talents bestowed upon different individuals. He explains that each individual receives various talents so that everyone can contribute something to society.

#### Gospel: John 2:1-11

Jesus and Mary attended a wedding where Mary informed Jesus that there was no more wine. At first he said it did not concern him, but then he turned several jugs of water into wine. His disciples were also present, and believed in him more strongly after they witnessed the first sign of glory he revealed to them.

#### Stewardship Is a Way of Life

"For it is in giving that we receive". St Francis

The Stewardship Way of Life is the grateful, unselfish response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God's gifts and shares these gifts in the love of God and their neighbor. It is a spiritual way of life marked by faith filled prayer, compassionate service to others and a generous sharing of time, talent and treasure. The more we give back to God, the richer our spiritual lives become. Jesus not only calls people to Him, but also forms them and sends them out in His service. Becoming a follower of Christ leads naturally to the practice of Stewardship, the living out a commitment to be Christ-centered rather than self-centered. Joining a Ministry is a way of thanking God for all the blessings He has granted to you and your family and helps to make our parish stronger and the world a better place for all. #### SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

If you are planning to have your child baptized, you should be aware of the following regulations:

Unless you receive prior permission, the child is to be baptized in your parish, which is the parish in which you are registered or where you live. All Catholics in the United States belong to a full territorial parish by virtue of their address.

You have to make a pledge to raise the child in the faith. If there is sufficient doubt in the priest's mind that the parents will not raise the child in the faith, he can refuse to do the baptism.

According to the new Code of Canon Law, the sponsors for the child (godparents) must both be baptized and one must be a practicing Roman Catholic. The new Code of Canon Law also insists that the Roman Catholic sponsor must have received both the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

Requests for a baptismal date should be made two months in advance. Parents having their first child baptized must participate in a preparation program.

#### SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are planning to be married, you should be aware of the following regulations:

The diocese requires one year notification to the parish before your marriage. If two Catholics are getting married, the marriage may take place in the parish of the bride or the groom. If they are getting married in another parish, they need a letter of permission from their own parish.

If a Catholic marries a non-Catholic and they wish to marry in a ceremony other than that of the Roman Catholic Church, this is possible but requires permission of the Church. All other regulations must be met. A non-Catholic minister can be part of a Catholic ceremony.

Pre-Cana is required before marriage. If either party has been married before, <u>whether Catholic or not</u>, an impediment exists which must be removed by the Church's Tribunal before they can remarry.

#### SACRAMENT OF THE SICK

Only a living person can receive one of the seven sacraments. Families should not wait until someone is on the verge of death to contact a priest. Anyone who is seriously ill, has a chronic illness, or is going to have major surgery should be anointed. It is a beautiful and comforting sacrament. Please call the office at 973.696.4411 if you or a member of your family wishes to be anointed.

"There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit. Spend a moment to recognize the gifts you have and are not using or are underused. Take another moment to encourage someone else about their gifts. One day the Lord will ask us why we failed to let the Spirit work through us.


