

The brief summary of today's Gospel: two men went up to the temple to pray – one didn't and one did.

The Pharisees were a group of dedicated Jewish laymen who attempted to practice the law as fully as possible. They took the law to its widest possible extent to be sure that they observed the smallest part of the law. This made this particular Pharisee feel good about himself. He had become self-righteous and felt that he was doing God a favor in all that he did.

The tax collector had the opposite attitude. Tax collecting was an unclean profession. He knew he was a sinner, so he approached God with humility. He was forgiven while the Pharisee was not, for the Pharisee did not even feel that he needed forgiveness.

The Pharisee, acting as though he is good as is and needs nothing from God, gets nothing. The tax collector, admitting his needs for God's mercy, is heard.



THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18

God is just and does not show favoritism, but hears the prayers of everyone. Anyone who serves God, no matter how lowly his position here on earth, will be heard and answered.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18

Paul writes to Timothy that he thinks his mission is near the end, and he is glad his faith is still strong. Paul hopes that all nations will hear the gospel. But, if he is executed as he anticipates, he is sure he will live forever in heaven.

Gospel: Luke 18:9-14

Jesus tells a parable about a Pharisee who went to the temple, and offered up a prayer of thanks because he was not a sinner like the tax collector who was also there to pray. The tax collector was far more humble, acknowledging his sins, and asking forgiveness for them. Jesus said the tax collector's prayer would be heard because, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, while he who humbles himself will be exalted."
